VITO TANZI Inter-American Development Bank



Prof. Vito Tanzi (PhD in Economics, Harvard University) has been a professor of economics and chairman of the Economics Department of the American University in Washington, D.C. (1967-1974); Chief of the Tax Policy Division (1974-1981) and Director of the Fiscal Affairs Department (1981-2000) at the International Monetary Fund; Senior Associate at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace (2000-2001); and Undersecretary in the Ministry of Economy and Finance of Italy (June 2001- June 2003). He has also been a consultant for the Organization of American States, the World Bank, the United Nations, and the Stanford Research Institute. In 1990-1994, he was President of the International Institute of Public Finance. He is currently Senior Consultant at the Inter-American Development Bank.

Over the years his main interests have been public finance and macroeconomics. He has had a sustained interest in fiscal developments of developing countries. In recent years he has been concerned with the long-run growth of public spending in industrial countries and more broadly with the role of the state in market economies. He has also written several papers on the economics of corruption and on the relationship between globalisation and fiscal systems. He is the author or the editor of many books and of hundreds of articles in professional economic journals.

He received honorary degrees from the University of Cordoba (Argentina), the University of Liege (Belgium), the University of Torino, and the University of Bari.
